there had been a conflict between the Chilean government and the Catholic church. The Catholic church owned the only cemetery in the capital city of Santiago. They would not allow any non-Catholic to be buried in their cemetery. Later, the government forced the Catholic Church to open up an area of their cemetery just for those who were non-Catholics.

The Catholic authorities didn't like having the two groups together so they built a wall 20 feet high and 6 feet deep separating the two areas in the cemetery. We met for prayer where that wall had been erected since it had a lot of significance to the Reformation.



MINISTERING AT NURSING HOMES

Julio Pavez, who is a member of our church, has been in 2 different nursing homes. At each one he was treated unfairly. In one, his wedding ring was stolen, in another he fell breaking 6 ribs with no medical assistance for over 3 days before being hospitalized. The outcome was pneumonia and great suffering.

This type of story is repeated over and over throughout Chile. Visiting Julio opened our eyes to the great need of reaching these forgotten people who are abandoned in a rest home facility. The majority of their families never visit them. They are lonely, lost, forgotten and are just waiting to die. At the present, 15% of Chile (2.5 million) are senior citizens. In Santiago, there are over 1 million and in our section of town there are 31,000 living in 60 nursing homes. Presently, we know of no one ministering to these people.

Returning to Chile, we want to organize groups to go in and visit the senior citizens taking music and the Gospel to them. The idea is to prepare them to meet their maker. Probably, 90% have never heard how to have a personal relationship with God, and how to invite Christ as their personal leader and forgiver of their life. They are just there, waiting, waiting, and waiting to die.

For many, their bodies are no longer functional and are bed ridden, but their minds and hearts still continue to be alert. Will you help us with a special Christmas gift so we can help people like Julio?

We would like to buy musical instruments (\$3,000) and purchase a used van (\$15,000) to take our teams to the senior rest homes.



God always goes before us and lays out our path. We've had great victories and the Lord is doing great things in Chile. During these past 51 years, we have been in total dependence on God, waiting on Him, and working with Him.

Daily we see amazing and beautiful fruit of the work God is doing through our ministry. Since the day we were called in the ministry in 1963, thousands have been impacted by the Gospel as we have the Spirit of the Lord on us, and he has anointed us to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent us to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor (Luke 4:18-19). So much has been accomplished through your prayers and generosity.
